Fires Reported in FireRMS

June 30, 2013, 12:31 a.m. – East Lansing Fire Department was dispatched to Spartan Village for a fire in a bedroom, the fire was out but there was still smoke in apartment. Fire personnel arrived to find MSU Police on the scene with the family outside. Firefighters entered the apartment and found smoke inside. They went to the bedroom and the fire appeared to be out. Fire personnel set up a positive pressure fan and went back into the bedroom and found smoke coming from the upper bunk mattress. They removed the mattress from the apartment and on the way out the mattress burst into flames. Firefighters placed it in the parking lot and extinguished with water from Truck 12. The fire had started on the underside of mattress with no obvious ignition source found. The mother stated that she came home from work at 12:30 a.m. and there was smoke in the bedroom. She then noticed flames in the mattress and poured a pot of water on it. Due to the fact that there was too much smoke in the apartment she then called 911. Trash and clothing were all over apartment covering the floors. Some of the clothing, laundry bag, purse and a spot on the floor had burned also. Contacted the EL Fire Inspector and MSU Police contacted their fire investigator and a person from housing department to relocate family. Fire personnel also informed MSU that the tenant removed the smoke detector after it sounded. Once the apartment was ventilated firefighters cleared the scene.
