**Fires Reported in FireRMS – page 1 of 2**

July 27, 2013, 5:01 a.m. - Dispatched to a location in the 100 block of Stoddard for a couch fire, no exposures. Firefighters arrived at the scene and found the same. Command was set up and the fire was extinguished. No hazards, other problems or witnesses were noted at the scene. The EL Fire Marshal was called and advised of the situation. Truck 12 then cleared the scene.

July 31, 2013, 12:34 a.m. - Called for a couch fire in the 400 block of Stoddard. Engine 11 responded, arrived, established command and found that an old couch set to the road for rubbish pick up had been lit on fire and was mostly burned out upon our arrival. Firefighters extinguished the remains with a 5/8 inch hose and pushed the debris to the side of the road. EL Police were on scene and had no suspects. Fire personnel terminated command, cleared and returned to station 1.

August 1, 2013, 1:54 a.m. – Toned out for a couch fire in the middle of the road at Spartan and Frye. Engine 11 responded, arrived, established command and extinguished what was left of a burning couch that was left out by the road for trash removal. Firefighters then moved the debris to the side of the road, terminated command and returned to station 1.

August 1, 2013, 1:17 p.m. – ELFD was called to a car fire on Abbey. Upon arrival with Battalion 11, Engine 11 personnel found the front of the car fully involved with heavy fire showing. The crew used the front jump line and about 375 gallons of water to extinguish the fire. They also used the halligan tool and a K 12 saw to force open the hood. The only other damage noted beyond the car was some fire damage to a tree nearby. Both the EL Fire Marshal and Inspector were on the scene from the onset. Engine 11 cleaned up equipment and cleared the scene.

## **Training Reported in FireRMS page 2 of 2**

July 29, 2013, 1:30-3:00 p.m. – Engine 11 and Battalion 11 did a walkthrough of the new BWL building on S. Washington.

July 30, 2013, 1:30-2:30 p.m. – DOT Guidebook Review – All on duty personnel went over Niosh for 4 chemicals and used NAERG to look up distances CAS# and whether the PID will read the chemical.

July 31, 13, 1:00-3:00 p.m. – Water Rescue - Practical water rescue class at Lake Lansing. Boat operations, water rescue throw bag deployment, and water safety were covered. The class was taught by EL Fire personnel. There was a lecture at station 1 in the morning.

August 1, 2013, - Water Rescue – EL personnel presented classroom and practical water rescue information and performed practical exercises on Lake Lansing. Personnel performed rope throw bag, boat course, and 1 and 2 person rescues.
