October 25, 2013, 2:28 p.m. – The EL Fire Inspector was contacted by EL Fire Marshal to follow-up on a vehicle fire that had occurred on the previous day. An MSU recycling vehicle was on Wood Street and was on its way to Grainger for service when the driver noticed smoke coming from the vehicle. The driver stated he pulled into the Grainger property and extinguished fire with the on board portable extinguisher. Some damage to wiring and air lines on the vehicle. The fires were not uncommon in vehicles that pick up waste. Examined burned material removed by the employees prior to arrival and photographed. No evidence of intentional ignition found.

October 26, 2013, 5:26 p.m. – EL Fire Department was called for a fire in the oven on Delta. Per dispatch the fire was out but there was smoke in the apartment and needed to be cleared. Engine 11 responded, arrived, established command and investigated to find that the resident had turned the oven on to preheat to cook some food. The apartment started to fill with smoke when they noticed that a roommate had placed a George Foreman grill in the oven for storage and it started to melt. There was no other damage except to the grill. Firefighters used the TIC to make sure there was no heat. The apartment had self ventilated, so fire personnel gathered information, terminated command and returned to station 1.

October 27, 2013, 2:46 p.m. - Dispatched to a dumpster fire behind Mason Hall. Truck 12 arrived at the scene to find a dumpster on fire and no exposures. Command was set up and Truck 12's crew attacked the fire with a front jump line. The fire was extinguished and dispatch was advised. No other problems or witnesses were noted so Truck 12 cleared the scene.

October 27, 2013, 4:29 p.m. – East Lansing Engine 11 was called to assist Meridian Township Fire Department on a room on fire in an apartment complex on Nemoke Trail. Battalion responded with Engine 11. Upon arrival Meridian command assigned EL Engine 11 to move the tempest fan to the second floor to better ventilate the apartment and bring a hose line in to back up MTFD firefighters. The interior crew reported that the fire was out prior to stretching the back-up line. EL Engine 11 assigned to overhaul and venting the rest of the building and reported no extension. The landlord arrived with the keys to the apartments. Engine 11 completed ventilation and then was cleared by MTFD Command.

Training Reported in FireRMS

October 29, 2013, 1:30-3:00 p.m. – Ventilation – All on duty personnel reviewed ventilation procedures and then drilled on ground ladders and peaked roof ventilation practices.
