### **Fires Reported in FireRMS - page 1 of 2**

January 20, 2014, 1:36 a.m. - Dispatched to Brody Road for a fire in a trash can that was out, removed to outside and just wanted fire personnel to investigate it. Truck 12 responded emergent with 4 on board. Upon arrival, noted no trash can in immediate area and Truck 12 investigated. Went into building and looked around for a bit before anyone noted the fire department was there. Found an assistant community director that was in an office who called 911. They stated that the trash can was in a bathroom and was put out by an RA with a "Styrofoam cup" and took the trash outside. They took us to a trash receptacle outside and pulled out a small plastic bag, Went back inside and noted no damage to receptacle or wall. RA not present that did the extinguishment but collected info from our contact person. At that time the RA that extinguished came by and said they sustained a small blister from the exposure on their palm but was all set. They confirmed that they extinguished with the cup and removed to outside. Truck 12 advised dispatch of findings, cleared and returned to the station.

### **Training Reported in FireRMS**

January 21, 2014, 1300-1500 – Medical – Three on duty station 2 personnel studied to prepare for ACLS recertification course scheduled for 1-23-14.

January 21, 2014, 1:00-2:30 p.m. Maps and Addressing – Three on duty station 2 personnel studied maps for both the East Lansing and MSU.

January 21, 2014, 1:30-2:30 p.m. – Equipment Training – All on duty station 1 personnel went over phase I & II recalls at a location on Ann St. Crews practiced recalls and then the phase II recall process of riding elevators throughout building. Fire alarm room was located and toured along with the emergency shutoff on the elevator and of the 8th floor.

January 22, 2014, 8:30-9:30 a.m. – Aerial Apparatus – Operations – One on duty firefighter worked with another on Truck 12 items: daily check sheet, aerial operations, pump operations and non emergency driving.

January 22, 2014, 1:30-3:00 p.m. – Medical – Two on duty firefighters reviewed State EMS Protocols.

January 22, 2014, 1:30-3:00 p.m. - Manipulative Driving Skills – One on duty firefighter did non emergency city driving test.

January 22, 2014, 1:30-3:30 p.m. – Medical – Two on duty firefighters reviewed for ACLS.

January 22, 2014, 1:30-2:30 p.m. – Pumper Operator – One on duty firefighter worked with two others on pump operations.

January 23, 2013, 1:30-2:30 p.m. – Fire Ground Operations – All on duty station 2 personnel were provided a video/teaching on an apartment complex fire from a video/info from blue card training. Reviewed strategy, tactics and how our SOG's fit this same scenario and how this would be addressed today if we had this happen.
