Fires Reported in FireRMS - page 1 of 2

January 24, 2014, 7:26 p.m. - Dispatched to a duplex on Burcham for a fire alarm sounding and smoke in the kitchen that was called in by neighbors. Prior to going en route dispatch stated that the homeowner stated no fire and wanted to cancel the response. The fire department responded non emergency to the scene. The resident met us at the front door and said that the roommate left a pan on the stove top unattended with the burner on. They turned the burner off, removed the pan and opened the doors and windows to clear out the smoke. Upon entering the duplex, noted light smoke and the smell of burnt food. Found no smoke or fire damage. The smoke detector was not sounding. The resident was going to leave the doors and windows open until odor was gone.

January 26, 2014, 9:48 p.m. - East Lansing Fire dispatched to a fire alarm on Albert. Truck 11 was assigned to the call and responded with four personnel. Dispatch advised that caller reported smoke in the upstairs area. Truck 11 requested a full response from East Lansing Fire. Battalion 11 responded, Truck 12 was first arriving unit and reported nothing visible from the exterior. Battalion 11 arrived and assumed command. Reported fire in a back bedroom by Truck 11 crew. An Engine from Lansing Fire requested by command. Communications with interior difficult. Truck 11 reported a small mattress fire, the fire was out and the mattress was removed from the home. Ventilation was performed by Truck 11 crew. Face to Face with Truck 12 officer done. The on-duty fire investigator was called. Cleared Truck 11. Medic 12 and Medic 11 cleared to respond to Burcham Hills. Stood by until the fire investigator arrived on scene. Battalion turned command back to Truck 12 and cleared the scene.

January 28, 2014, 9:42 a.m. - Called to Snyder for a chimney fire that was extinguished by the occupants. Battalion 11 arrived to find nothing visible and established command. Assigned Truck 11 to investigate and they reported back that there was no issue after verifying with the thermal imaging camera. Fire personnel cleared.
