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**Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 4**

June 28, 2014, 6:57 p.m. – East Lansing Fire Department was dispatched to a location on Cambria for a fire alarm and smell of smoke. Dispatch was advised to put Battalion 11 on the call. Battalion went en route and arrived at the scene, set up command and investigated. The front door was unlocked, noted light smoke, no heat or fire on the first floor. All units were advised and to had dispatch tone out station 2. Engine 11 and Medic 11 arrived at the scene was assigned fire attack. They advised there was a small fire on the 2nd floor and vented the front window from the inside and positive pressure ventilation was set up. Truck 12 and Medic 12 arrived at the scene and were assigned water supply and RIT. Truck 12 completed the water supply and their ladder was set up for a secondary egress. Fire attack advised that the fire was out. Truck 12 was assigned search group and completed primary and secondary search of the apartment building, no problems noted. The EL Fire Marshal was requested via dispatch. Engine 11 and Truck 12 crew performed salvage and overhaul. Fire Marshal arrived at the scene and all crews assisted with clean up. Station 2 units were cleared. Battalion 11 cleared the scene and transferred command to Engine 11.

July 4, 2014, 10:22 p.m. – ELFD was was dispatched to assist MTFD on a house fire on Newton Road. Dispatch advised that the house was abandoned. EL Battalion 11 went en route and arrived at the scene to find MTFD initiating an exterior fire attack on a two story residential structure. There was smoke with heavy damage noted to the structure. EL Battalion 11 was assigned operations by MTFD Command. ELFD crews assisted MTFD crews with an exterior fire attack, ventilation and overhaul. EL Medic 11 was requested to the scene for medical assistance. Meridian command cleared East Lansing Battalion 11 and Engine 11. EL Medic 11 transported one MTFD firefighter to the hospital.

July 8, 2014, 9:11 p.m. - ELFD air trailer requested mutual aid to Leslie Fire for a commercial structure fire at the location of Covert Bellevue. Firefighters filled approximately 80 SCBA tanks while Ingham County rescue left to refill their air unit. Upon their return, ELFD was cleared by command.

## **Fires Reported in FireRMS page 2 of 4**

July 10, 2014, 2:08 a.m. – EL Fire was called to something burning behind W. Grand River. Upon arrival firefighters found 2 couches on fire that were on a fence. They used the front jump line to put the fire out. A parked car nearby had some damage to a tail light and bubbled paint from the heat. ELPD was trying to locate the owner and would pass this information on to us. The EL Fire Marshal was called about the situation and then Engine 11 cleared the scene.

July 10, 2014, 8:39 p.m. – East Lansing Fire Department was dispatched to Reniger for stove fire that was now out and the fire alarm was still sounding. Truck 12 went en route with 3 personnel on board. They arrived on the scene of a 4 story structure multi residential with nothing visible from the exterior, occupants seen outside and fire personnel investigated. Firefighters went up to a room and noted a light haze on the floor. The occupant had the door open and was still inside and advised them in the future to leave the apartment. The occupant was cleaning the stove and range hood. No fire damage to either the stove, hood or surrounding cabinets. Individuals stated that they were cooking a pot of water with potatoes in it. It was an electric stove in which to product in the drip pan caught on fire. They removed the pot from the stove, turned off the burner and then tried to extinguish by hitting it with a dish towel. The occupants had fan going and no smoke noted. There was a haze in the hallway that dissipated quickly. Fire personnel gathered information and then cleared.

July 11, 2014, 10:00 p.m. – EL Engine 11 was dispatched to a parking lot on Haslett Road across from H&H Mobile for a log smoldering. Engine 11 responded non-emergency to scene and unable to announce arrival due to radio traffic from LFD. Engine 11 met with employee of H&H Mobile who showed firefighters a log he had pulled from a brushy area and had extinguished it with water. No obvious ignition sources were noted. Engine 11 identified an approx. 1-2' split charred log on the asphalt. Engine 11 cleared the scene and returned to station 1. This was reported to the EL Fire Marshal via email.

July 12, 2014, 4:40 p.m. – ELFD was dispatched Brody Road for a small fire next to a building. Upon arrival found a small fire burning in some wood chips next to a fence. Firefighters extinguished with a water fire extinguisher and then cleared.

July 15, 2014, 10:11 a.m. – EL Fire responded to a location on Garden City Road. Medic 11 was near the incident when the alarm came in and confirmed their response with Battalion 11. Fire personnel found residents outside of a 2-story campus apartment building and the alarm was sounding. One of the residents said that it was food on the stove. Inside after meeting with another resident they advised that oil was on the stove burner, it ignited and a very small flame was extinguished with a wet towel that then filled the apartment with smoke. Firefighters assisted the resident with natural ventilation of apartment. Truck 12 arrived, gathered information and reset the alarm.

### **Fires Reported in FireRMS page 3 of 4**

June 18, 2014, 11:25 a.m. - ELFD dispatched to East Lansing Dr. for apartment building with burned vinyl siding. Truck 12 responded emergency. It was a long response from Station 2 with Hagadorn Road closed between Burcham and Haslett. Truck 12 arrived, nothing showing and investigated. Firefighters located and area of burned mulch up against building. A 4x6 area of siding had melted. The thermal imaging camera showed normal heat on both the outside and inside wall. A water fire extinguisher was used to soak the mulch, completed the extinguishment and removed the siding along the damaged wall. The EL Fire Inspector was requested, arrived and information passed on to him. Truck 12 then cleared.

### **Training Reported in FireRMS**

July 1, 2 various times – Aerial Operator – 4 personnel had performed their driving proficiency practical test.

July 3, 2014, 1:30-3:30 p.m. - Manipulative Driving Skills – 2 personnel had their annual driving/operating on public roads test.

July 9, 2014 - Hazardous Materials Technician – 1 person attended. No description of the class.

July 9, and 10, 2014 – Airway Management and Ventilation – On duty personnel attended. No description of the class.

July 15 and 17, 2014 – High/Low Angle Rescue – Station 1 and 2 took turns sending on duty personnel to the high angle rescue class with new rope equipment on MSU Campus.

July 15, 2-3 p.m. – Other Driver/Operator Training – 3 on duty personnel had their driver training road test.

July 22 and 23, 2014, various times – Cargo Tank - Class given on response to emergencies involving tankers carrying hydrocarbons. Class was held at the Lansing Fire Department training site.
