**Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 2**

May 16, 2014, 9:49 p.m. - Called to a burning complaint on Albert and Spartan Avenue. Upon arrival the residents had a small fire in the parking area /backyard burning and did not have a burning permit. Fire personnel ask the residents to put the fire out and then cleared the scene.

May 18, 2014, 10:38 a.m. – EL Engine 11 was dispatched to a restaurant on Grand River for an oven fire they believed was out. Fire personnel arrived to find nothing showing on 4 story structure. They were contacted by the EL Fire Marshal upon arrival stating the fire was out and ventilation needed. Engine 11 crew began ventilation while the fire officer began investigation. The District Manager stated the electric oven began to arc and flames shooting from the outlet. They shut off the power at the circuit panel and then extinguished the remaining fire with an ABC fire extinguisher. The fire marshal was on the scene contacting the health department to begin process of recovery. No fire alarms noted within the business and nothing sounding upon arrival. There was damage to the outlet and surrounding area as well as to the rear of oven. Ventilation completed, information gathered and the scene was left to the fire marshal.

May 18, 2014, 11:10 p.m. - ELFD was dispatched to the 100 block of Maplewood for an illegal bon fire. Truck 12 responded non-emergency and arrived to find the fire was out. No one was home at the time and referred it to fire prevention.

## **Fires Reported in FireRMS page 2 of 2**

May 21, 2014, 1:15 a.m. - East Lansing Fire dispatched to a fire on the deck at the 1600 block of E. Grand River. A full box alarm was dispatched with a total of 11 personnel responding. Dispatch reported fire on third story deck with possible extension to second floor. Truck 12 arrived and entered the building to investigate. Battalion 11 arrived on scene and assumed Grand River Command. Engine 11 told to stage on Grand River for possible water supply. Interior reported small fire on exterior deck. Interior requested a crew with a water can to come to the apartment. Medic 12 assigned to assist Truck 12 crew with overhaul and complete extinguishment. Medic 11 assigned to act as RIC, Engine 11 crew reassigned to check for extension in second floor apartment. No extension found. On-duty inspector was driver of Engine 11 so investigation was assigned to him. The fire was declared out, medic units were cleared and Engine 11 was also cleared once the on-duty inspector was done. DTN management contacted via dispatch to respond. Battalion 11 terminated command and cleared the scene turning the scene to Truck 12 to await the arrival of management company.

May 22, 2014, 10:00 – 11:15 p.m. – Infections Disease Control – Annual refresher course for Infectious Disease Prevention. An EL Firefighter and Captain taught the class. All on-duty A-shift personnel attended.
