**Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 2**

May 26, 2014, 01:55 a.m. - Engine11 dispatched to couch fire at Stoddard and Beech Street. While en route, Engine 11 was updated per East Lansing Police that the fire was out except for minimal flames. Engine 11 downgraded to normal traffic and arrived to find smoldering remains of a mattress in the middle of Beech Street just west of Stoddard. Firefighters extinguished the embers and put the remains at the edge of the street. They also noted some damage to the asphalt. Engine 11 contacted the EL Fire Inspector via cell and then cleared the scene and returned to station #1.

May 31, 2014, 5:33 p.m. – EL Battalion was called to assist Lansing Fire Department at Coachlight Commons for a structure fire. He arrived and was assigned to monitor safety of operations. Nothing unusual while doing this and then cleared by Lansing Fire Command.

June 4, 2014, 5:57 a.m. – EL Fire was called for an assist to Meridian Township Fire Department for a house fire on Raby Road. Engine 11 assigned to pulling ceilings and stopping extension. Medic 11 assigned to RIT. Battalion 11 assisted command with strategy and tactics. Engine 11 investigated the structure with the Thermal Imaging Camera and found no extension.
