August 9, 2014, 2:28 a.m. - Dispatched to apartments on North Shore for a possible structure fire. Battalion 11 requested a TAC channel. Arrival to find nothing showing at a two story, wood framed apartment building. Truck 11 arrived and assigned to investigate the interior and once inside reported that it was a ceiling fan motor that had burned out in ½ bath. There was a small amount of fire that firefighters extinguished with a water can. The smoke was vented via PPV fan and all other units cleared. The East Lansing Fire Marshal was requested. Fire personnel contacted the building management company to send over maintenance personnel. Fire command was then turned over to Truck 11 and then Battalion 11 cleared.

August 11, 2014, 00:20 a.m. – ELFD was dispatched to Stoddard and Albert for something burning in the roadway. Truck 11 was updated while en route it was a chair on fire that was almost fully consumed. Fire personnel arrived to find a chair still burning in roadway. The crew extinguished the remaining chair and then overhauled the debris and moved it to the sidewalk area. The EL Fire Marshal was contacted via cell for notification. Truck 11 then cleared the scene and returned to station #1.

August 13, 2014, 1:22 a.m. – East Lansing Fire was toned out for a couch fire at Spartan and Albert. Truck 12 went en route emergent with 3 on board. They arrived to find a frame of a couch still on fire in the intersection. East Lansing Police were out at the scene. The fire was extinguished and no individuals were around who witnessed anything. Firefighters removed the debris from the road and they advised dispatch that they were clear and returning to the station.

Training Reported in FireRMS

August 12, 2013, 1-3 p.m. – Manipulative Driving Skills – Two on duty fire officers completed their driving proficiency course test.

August 12, 2013, 1-1:30 p.m. – Computer – Basic Info – One on duty firefighter completed their Security Mentor for the month that was issued by the city for completion.

August 13, 2014, no time listed – Vehicle Extrication – Tools and Equipment – On duty personnel performed vehicle extrication training with shift personnel at station #1. Classroom portion performed of overview of cribbing and the vehicle stabilization kit. Practical training had the firefighters performed cribbing and lifting with the air bags. They then performed utilizing the vehicle stabilization kit to stabilize a vehicle. Lastly, personnel went over the heavy rescue tools with regards to operation and utilizing the chain tips for the rescue spreader.

August 14, 2014, 1:30-3:30 p.m. – Self Rescue – On duty personnel performed Mayday training for crew at station #1. The class watched a NFPA Mayday video and then reviewed Mayday and RIT protocol. Lastly, participants performed a simulated Mayday and self-rescue techniques.
