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**Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 2**

September 6, 2014, 10:07 p.m. - Called for a couch fire in the road at Harrison and Oak Street. T-12 responded, arrived, established command, extinguished the fire and moved the debris to the side of the road. Command terminated, cleared and returned to station 2.

September 6, 2014, 10:32 p.m. - East Lansing Fire was dispatched to a TV on fire in the alley next to the 200 block of Elizabeth. Engine 11 was assigned to the call and responded with 3 personnel. They arrived and found a TV fully with no exposures. Firefighters used the front 1-3/4" trash line and 125 gallons of water to extinguish the fire. The remains of the TV were moved to the side of the alley. Once the on duty fire inspector was notified of the incident, the engine cleared and returned to the station.

September 6, 2014, 10:52 p.m. - Called for a couch fire in the road in the 100 block of Stoddard. T-12 responded, established command and found a futon on fire. Fire personnel extinguished it with a 5/8" hose. The debris was then moved to the side of the road, command was terminated, units cleared and returned to service.

September 6, 2014 11:06 p.m. - T-12 was returning from a previous assignment and came across this mattress fire in the roadway at Stoddard and Beech. They established command and extinguished the fire with a 5/8" hose. Firefighters moved the debris to the side of the road, terminated command, cleared and returned to station 2.

September 7, 2014, 12:45 a.m. - Called for a couch fire in the roadway at River and Victor. T-12 responded, arrived and established command. What firefighters found was a small refrigerator on fire that they extinguished with a 5/8" hose. Once done, they moved the debris to the side of the road, terminated command, cleared and returned to station 2.
