



City of East Lansing Fire Department Incident Report July 24 to August 7, 2014

Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 3

July 25, 2014, 9:32 p.m. - Dispatched to a possible structure fire at a school on Burcham. Dispatch advised all units to switch to Metro 1. Medic 11 arrived at the scene and advised it was a dumpster fire only; no structure involved. Engine 11 arrived at the scene, set up command and initiated fire attack. Station #2 units were cleared from the call. Battalion 11 arrived and assumed command. Medic 11 was assigned to check the roof of the structure for possible fire extension with no problems noted. Engine 11's crew advised that the fire was out. Medic 11 was dispatched to another call. Battalion 11 turned command over to Engine 11.

July 26, 2014, 2:19 a.m. - East Lansing Fire was dispatched to a dumpster fire on Burcham. Engine 11 was assigned to the call and responded with three personnel. The Engine arrived on scene and found a dumpster that rekindled from 9:32 p.m. on July 25, 2014. There were no flames; only material was smoking. The engine crew pulled a 1 3/4" front trash line and used 500 gallons of water and five gallons of foam to extinguish the fire. Fire was declared out by Engine 11 officer and they then cleared and returned to quarters. The on-duty fire inspector contacted and notified.

July 28, 2014, 2:09 a.m. - ELFD was called to assist LFD on a structure fire on Lathrop Street. EL Battalion made contact with their command who informed that the fire was out so they cleared us.

July 30, 2014, 7:15 a.m. - EL Fire responded to Evergreen for a mattress burning in the middle of front yard. Command was established and found no exposures. The fire was extinguished with a front jump line, command was terminated and Truck 11 cleared.

July 31, 2014, 5:25 p.m. - ELFD was toned out for a car fire with smoke coming from lower, front, passenger side of engine. The hood was open and extinguished with a 2.5 gallon water extinguisher. The car was to be towed for repair, no obvious damage and Engine 11 cleared.

Fires Reported in FireRMS page 2 of 3

August 2, 2014, 3:00 a.m. – EL Fire was called for a mattress fire on Harrison and Oak. Upon arrival a futon was in the roadway and mostly all burned up. Firefighters put out the remaining wood and moved it out of the roadway. After clearing the roadway of debris, cleared the scene and returned to the station. Fire personnel also noted that this was intentionally set by unknown person or persons.

August 2, 2014, 7:29 p.m. – Engine 11 was dispatched to a dumpster fire on State Street. They arrived to find a recycling dumpster at DPW on fire with cardboard contents. ELPD was on the scene in the parking lot. Engine 11 extinguished the fire within container and noted nothing unusual to the surrounding area or container. Firefighters opened the container to overhaul and extinguish the remaining materials. They then met with ELPD officer who was notified that a caller had stated that her grandson had thrown a lighter in the dumpster. The EL Fire Inspector was notified him of the situation and given the information. Engine 11 cleared the scene and returned to station #1. Damage was limited to the recycling container and seemed to be cosmetic in nature as the container was built of steel.

July 24, 2014, 8:30-10:30 a.m. - Metro HazMat - The class was held at the LFD training tower. Five EL on duty personnel attended this class on 306/406 tanker trailers for fuel and other materials hauling reviewed.

July 24, 2014, 1:30-2:30 – Cargo Tank – Five on duty personnel attended this class on HazMat training at LFD tower with 306/406 type tankers.

July 24, 2014, 1:30-4:00 p.m. – Manipulative Driving Skills - On duty firefighters completed their annual driver's training via the road course.

July 30 and 31, 2014 – Hazmat Incident Procedures – The FRIB was toured by all on duty fire personnel at the open excavation site and building A164.

August 6, 2014, 1:30 – 2:45 - Driver/Operator Training – On duty personnel had their annual driver's training via the road course.

August 6, 2014, 3:30-3:45 p.m. – Annual Fire Gear Inspection – One on duty firefighter completed their annual gear inspection and the form was submitted to the Safety Training Officer.

August 6, 2014, 3:30-3:45 p.m. – Inspecting/Care/Maintain SCBA – One on duty firefighter successfully completed their SCBA competency for the year and the form was submitted to the Safety Training Officer.

August 7, 2014, no time listed – Manipulative Driving Skills – Two on duty fire personnel completed their driving course using Truck 11.
