October 10, 2014, 8:01 p.m. – ELFD was called to assist Meridian Township Fire Department for a possible structure fire on East Lake Drive. East Lansing Battalion 11 responded with Engine 11. EL Command made contact with Meridian Township Lake Drive command and confirmed that they wanted East Lansing to come in from the north of E. Lake Dr. While en route, a MTFD crew on the scene stated no fire, just a light haze possibly due to an overheated water heater. Meridian command cleared East Lansing units shortly thereafter.

October 11, 2014, 7:31 a.m. – ELFD was dispatched to a possible structure fire on Ann Street. Dispatch advised that the occupants said the house was filling with smoke and were then told by dispatch to evacuate. While en route, EL Command advised dispatch to assign units to a TAC channel. On arrival, nothing visible, established command, and assigned Engine 11 to investigate upon their arrival. The occupants were outside and station 2 units staged at the intersection. Engine 11 crew stated that there was a light smoke in the house and found a small fire behind the refrigerator that was mainly burning embers. Medic 11 crew was assigned to set up positive pressure ventilation. The EL Fire Investigator was also notified and en route. Station 2 units were cleared along with Battalion 11 and Medic 11 as well. Command was passed on to Engine 11 personnel.

October 11, 2014, 11:43 p.m. - Dispatched for a couch fire on River Street. Advised that the fire was nearly out but was near a building. Truck 12 responded emergent with 3 on board. Fire personnel arrived to find a couch burned and a few embers still smoldering in the street. The couch was dragged to the sidewalk and doused with a bucket of water. Firefighters scooped ashes from road and saturated with water as well. Truck 12 then advised dispatch of the situation and then cleared and were available.
