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**Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 2**

February 15, 2015, 2:23 p.m. – East Lansing T-11 was dispatched to the 200 block of Albert for a fire alarm sounding with no active fire. They arrived to find a fire alarm sounding within the business. An employee led them to kitchen area where they stated that the cook had burnt food. The cook was busy cleaning the area with soap and water. He stated the fire alarm had activated. T-11 was unable to locate a fire alarm panel. Fire personnel contacted the EL Fire Prevention who advised them to investigate the cooking area. After probing the employee they admitted that the commercial suppression system had discharged "green water". Fire personnel were then directed by the Fire Marshal to shut down the exhaust and hood system from the circuit panel, which they did. The alarm was shut off with the power to the hood system. Fire personnel then advised the employee that they were to contact a company for re-arming of their suppression system. They were also told that they were not to cook or serve food until the system was repaired. Again, called the EL Fire Prevention with a follow-up as to the systems condition. T-11 then cleared and returned to station #1.

February 19, 2015, 4:59 p.m. – ELFD was dispatched for smoke in the basement at Hubbard Hall. EL Battalion 11 was called by EL Truck 12 as a full response to smoke in the basement. Arrived to find nothing visible and assumed command. Dispatch received calls for smoke on the 4th floor. EL M-12 was assigned to T-12. EL T-11 and M-11 were assigned to the 4th floor to evacuate and ventilate. LFD Truck, Engine and Battalion were called for mutual aid. EL T-12 reported that the fire was out prior to their arrival so LFD units were cancelled. EL T-11 and M-11 were assigned to ventilate the building. After ventilation was completed, T-12 reported that the duct work was warm and that they were going to remove and inspect further. T-12 reported all units could clear and command was turned over to them.

**Training Reported in FireRMS**

February 17, 2015, 1:15-2:45 p.m. – Fire Ground Management - Covered RIT responsibilities, size up, Blue Card concepts and reading smoke.

February 18, 2015, 1:30-3:30 p.m. – Pumper Operator - Firefighters watched the interactive video on FRC pump operations for T-11. They then spent the next 30 minutes cleaning and inspecting SCBA's with disinfectant. Also, went over the new UHF radio designations.
