Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 2

February 28, 2015, 6:44 p.m. - Dispatched to an illegal burn in the 500 block of Hagadorn. Upon arrival found a contractor who had burned a cardboard box in back yard of residence in a fire pit. The fire was out and fire units cleared.

February 28, 2015, 11:20 p.m. - Dispatched to the 400 block of Grove for a stove fire. While en route fire personnel were advised that the fire was out. Upon arrival tenants told T-11 crew that they were cooking tacos in the oven, the food caught on fire and that they used a dry chemical fire extinguisher to put the fire out. There were audible alarm sounding and the fire was contained to the stove with no extension. The fire panel was reset to normal. The EL Fire Inspector was contacted regarding fire, smoke detector hanging from ceiling in the apartment and use of the dry chem extinguisher. Fire department units then cleared with dispatch.

March 1, 2015, 2:33 a.m. – ELFD responded to the corner of Fry and Spartan for a couch on fire in road. Firefighters extinguished it with snow and a shovel and then T-12 cleared.

March 2, 2015, 1:40 p.m. - EL M-12 was dispatched to assist Lansing Fire and Delhi Fire on Kieppes Ct. for a trailer fire. Dispatch canceled M-12 en route to the scene.

March 2, 2015, 2:29 p.m. – EL Fire was called to a full response on a garage fire on Haslett Road. While en route dispatched advised this is in Meridian Township and canceled us. Then a short time later, EL T-12 only was requested back. Firefighters were in the area of Marsh and Haslett roads and responded. T-12 arrived to find a two car unattached garage with smoke coming from the structure. Command ordered EL Fire personnel to take in a line and start a fire attack. Firefighters pulled a 1-3/4 preconnect and entered the structure through a side door. There was a lot of stuff inside and getting around was difficult. Fire personnel could see fire in the back corner of the garage up in the loft/attic area. EL Fire personnel extinguished the fire while another firefighter opened the main door. After the fire was knocked down, they searched for hot spots. Tarps were placed over as much of the stuff as possible to prevent water damage. After it was determined to be completely out, EL was cleared by Meridian command. They retrieved equipment and left the fire scene.

March 3, 2015, 8:30-10:15 a.m. - Hazardous Materials Identification – 6 on duty personnel attended the hazmat monitor class at Delta Fire Department.

March 3, 2015, 1:30-3:30 p.m. – Respirator Fit Test – 6 duty personnel went to MSU/EHS who provided fit testing for the N95 mask and the Scott mask.

March 5, 2015, 8:30-10:00 a.m. – Hazardous Materials Identification – 6 on duty personnel attended a hazmat monitoring class at Delta Township Fire Department. They sat through a presentation given by a person from Delta Fire and fire personnel also performed some sample testing.
