**Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 3**

April 13, 2015, 11:58 a.m. - Received a telephone call from a location on Trowbridge Road that stated they had had a very small fire and were requesting that the fire inspector to investigate. Upon his arrival he met with the director. The staff on scene showed the equipment involved and described what happened. They had a very small fire that was put out by staff with a dry chemical extinguisher. The EL Fire Marshal and EL Electrical Inspector were informed also.

April 16, 2015, 2:15 p.m. - T-11 was dispatched to possible illegal burn on Kensington. T-11 arrived to find the occupant burning brush in the driveway. They were advised that it is illegal to burn brush and leaves. The occupant was compliant and extinguished the fire with a hose. T-11 gathered information, returned to station #1 and notified fire prevention of the event.

April 16, 2015, 8:37 p.m. - T-11 was dispatched to a dumpster fire on Abbot Road and arrived to find a dumpster smoking with no visible flames. They investigated and found a bag of trash inside a nearly empty dumpster on fire. Firefighters extinguished the bag and flooded the dumpster. They then cleared the scene and notified fire prevention via email.

April 17, 2015, 6:19 p.m. - ELFD was dispatched to a location on Shaw Lane for a bush on fire. T-12 responded emergency and arrived to find a small bush smoking. The fire extinguished with garden hose/tank water and then T-12 cleared.

### **Fires Reported in FireRMS page 2 of 3**

April 18, 2015, 9:32 p.m. - Dispatched to a grass fire on Harrison & Mt Hope. T-12 was at the scene and advised there was 2-3 acres on fire with exposures on the North and West side. B-11 arrived at the scene, assumed command and requested Lansing Fire Department assistance for two engines, two brush vehicles and B-41. Harrison Road was closed, South of Service and North of Mt Hope. LFD units arrived at the scene and were assigned duties. Lansing E-41 advised a utility pole was arcing and Consumers was requested to the scene. All rigs advised that the fire was out and then ask to check for hot spots. MSU Fire Prevention was advised of the situation. Consumers arrived at the scene and Lansing units cleared the scene. EL T-12 was dispatched to a fire alarm on campus and M-11 was requested to the scene for cleanup assistance. MSU police were also advised of the (3) gates that were breached. Command was terminated and all EL units cleared the scene.

April 19, 2015, 11:10 p.m. - T-11 was dispatched to Sunset for a fire alarm, arrived to find the occupants evacuated and the alarm sounding in the residence. T-11 investigated to find occupant had burned food in the microwave that tripped the smoke head in the basement and it was being aired out. The fire alarm system was reset to normal operation and then T-11 cleared the scene.

April 20, 2015, 7:13 p.m. – ELFD was called for mutual to Meridian Township Fire Department for a structure fire on Eastwood. Cancelled by Meridian B-91 prior to arrival.

April 23, 2015, 9:00 a.m. - ELFD was dispatched to Wilson Road for a fire alarm. T-12 responded, arrived to find nothing showing and investigated. MSU Physical plant stated there was a small fire in the closet of a kitchenette. An MSU Physical Plant HVAC employee located the fire prior the fire department and emptied the combustible materials from the closet and placed them in the sink. There was also a melted butane lighter found at the back of the closet buried under papers, trash, ect. There was minimal damage to the inside of closet and the smoke was vented via positive pressure ventilation and the physical plant increased HVAC to building to further clear the smoke. The fire alarm panel was reset to normal and the MSU Fire Marshal arrived on the scene.

April 23, 2015, 2-3 p.m. – Incident Management Systems – All on duty personnel attended a incident management presentation of Blue Card definitions.
