**Training Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 2**

May 29, 2015, 1:17 p.m. - Called to a car fire on Rosewood. The fire was put out by the resident prior to our arrival. The fire started in the center of the engine compartment around the air cleaner. Most of the damage was wiring and some plastic parts in a small area. The EL Fire Marshal was called, turned the scene over to him and then Truck 11 cleared.

May 30, 2015, 12:40 a.m. - Called for a kitchen fire on Abbot Road. Updated en route that the sprinkler system activated. Initially dispatched to one address on Abbot and then updated to another address on Abbot Rd. Arrived to find nothing visible. Truck 11 and Medic 11 assigned as attack group and they reported that the sprinkler contained the fire and the sprinkler needed to be shut off. Truck 12 obtained the keys from the clubhouse, located the sprinkler shut off and shut down the system. All floors were checked and residences were allowed to shelter in place. The apartment below the effected apartment had some water damage but it appeared to be contained to the two apartments. The residence of the apartment was sheltered in Medic 11 with the intern ride along and the EL Fire Marshal was contacted. Truck 11 advised that the sprinkler was shut off and all units could clear. Battalion 11 transferred command to Truck 11 while they waited for the Fire Marshal to arrive.

June 3, 2015, 7:21 a.m. - Called for a fire alarm sounding on Wilson Road. Truck 12 responded, arrived, established command and investigated to find the annunciator panel showed the smoke detector activation. Firefighters then proceeded to that location to find some smoke and odor of something burning. They called for a full alarm and returned to Truck 12 for equipment and the radiation monitor due to warning symbols on the door of radioactive materials in the room. Battalion 11 arrived and assumed command. Firefighters returned to the room and laid the high rise bag from the stand pipe, but did not charge it and turned on the radiation monitor. They made entry to room and the smoke had already started to dissipate. They found what appeared to be some kind of cooking/boiling unit that was red hot/smoldering that they unplugged. A report was given to EHS and MSU PD and the scene was turned over them. Command was terminated and they returned to station 2.

## **Training Reported in FireRMS page 2 of 2**

June 3, 2015, 8:28 p.m. – EL Truck 11 was dispatched to fire alarm sounding and smoke coming from apartment on Arbor Glen Drive. Truck 11 arrived to find the occupants waiving us down to a different apartment building. Firefighters investigated to the smell of something burning coming from one of the apartments. Fire personnel banged on door with no answer. No access keys located on exterior of structure. ELPD requested by Truck 11 and then they forced entry and found the oven on high with a baking pan in it. The apartment was filled with moderate smoke but no damage to the oven exterior or cabinetry. Truck 11 began to ventilate the apartment and then an initial search did not find any occupants. However, a dog was found on a secondary search. The owner was contacted via the dog tag cell phone number. Then management was contacted and notified of the damage to the entry door. The EL Fire Inspector was also called regarding the incident. The occupant came home and secured the apartment and dog. Information was gathered and then Truck 11 cleared the scene and returned to Station #1.

June 4, 2015, 1:47 a.m. – Truck 11 was dispatched to fence fire at Oakhill and Abbot Road. Upon arrival Truck 11 was directed by a bystander in the wrong direction down the alleyway. Firefighters eventually found a wooden fence surrounding dumpsters on fire. They extinguished the fire, overhauled the area and then cleared the scene and returned to station #1.
