



City of East Lansing Fire Department Weekly Incident Report June 19-25, 2015

Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 3

June 20, 2015, 5:18 p.m. - East Lansing Fire was dispatched to a car fire on Deerpath. Truck 11 was assigned to the call and responded with 3 personnel. They arrived and found a crossover SUV with smoke and fire coming from the engine compartment. Firefighters used a 1 ¾" front trash line and 250 gallons of water to extinguish the fire. They also used a circular saw to cut the hood latch and opened the hood to finish extinguishing the engine compartment. There was no extension in to the interior of the car. Once extinguished the fire officer had dispatch contact the on-duty EL Fire Investigator to respond to the scene. Fire personnel remained until the fire investigator arrived and gave a report to him.

June 21, 2015, 1:40 a.m. - Called for a dumpster fire on Louis Street. Upon arrival firefighters found a fully involved dumpster. They put the fire out and then cleared.

June 21, 2015, 12:38 p.m. - Dispatched to a possible structure fire on Deerpath. While enroute, had dispatch assign a TAC channel. Dispatch advised that the police were on the scene and did not seeing anything. Fire personnel arrived, established command and reported nothing visible. Truck 11 was assigned to investigate, and station 2 units were assigned to stage at the nearest hydrant. Fire personnel reported that there was no fire but it was food in the oven and just needed the positive pressure fan set up for ventilation. Station 2 units were canceled and then all other units cleared from scene shortly thereafter.

June 23, 2015, 9:08 p.m. - ELFD was called for a possible illegal burn on Marigold. Upon arrival they found an uncontained, but attended, rubbish fire in the back yard. Fire personnel advised the residences to put the fire out with a garden hose due to the fact that they had no permit. They also advised them about the possible fines and the occupant stated they didn't know about the laws. The EL Fire Marshal was contacted per the telephone about the matter. The occupant will get a permit prior to any more fires. Truck 12 then cleared.

Fires Reported in FireRMS page 2 of 3

June 24, 2015, 2:06 a.m. – EL Fire was dispatched to a structure fire on W. Saginaw. They were advised en route that flames and smoke were coming from the basement. Dispatch also advised that all the occupants were out of the structure. Battalion 11 arrived at the scene to find a single story residential structure with smoke showing from the D-side of the building. Saginaw command was setup. Truck 11 and Medic 11 were assigned fire attack. Truck 12 was assigned water supply and Medic 12 to RIT. Dispatch was advised to shut down the west and east bound lanes of Saginaw. The fire attack group reported there was a fire in the basement. Water supply was established and Truck 12 was reassigned as vent group to ventilate the structure. The fire attack group reported that the fire was out and a primary and secondary search of the residence was completed, no victims found. Truck 11, Truck 12, and Medic 11 completed salvage and overhaul of the basement. Dispatch was advised to contact the on-call EL Fire Investigator and Fire Chief. All units assisted in cleanup. The fire marshal arrived at the scene and was advised of the situation. Station 2 units were cleared. Command was passed to Truck 11 and then Battalion 11 and Medic 11 cleared the scene.

June 24, 2015, 8:36 p.m. - East Lansing Fire was dispatched to a report of something on fire on Grove. Truck 11 was assigned to the call and responded. They arrived and police were on the scene and reported that it was a ball cap and that the fire was out. Truck crew confirmed that and then the cap was thrown in the trash and then Truck 11 cleared and returned to quarters.

June 25, 2015, 8:14 a.m. - Called to a car fire on West Road. Upon arrival found light smoke coming from the engine compartment. Fire personnel unlocked the car and popped the hood. They found small flames in the back of the engine compartment. They used a water extinguisher to put the fire out and then pulled out a lot of burned insulation. All the burned damage was to the back fire wall area. The EL Fire Marshal was called and all the information received from the owner was passed on to him as well. Truck 11 then cleared the scene.

June 23, 24 and 25, 2015, a.m. and p.m. – Manipulative Driving Skills - On duty personnel from station 1 and station 2 rotated between the morning and afternoon for this training.

June 23, 24 and 25, 2015, p.m. – New EMS Equipment – On duty personnel had a refresher on the new Life Pak Heart Monitors that will be going into service soon.
