



City of East Lansing Fire Department Two Week Incident Report June 26 - July 9, 2015

Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 2

June 26, 2015, 4:15 a.m. – The East Lansing Fire Marshal assisted Westphalia Fire Department with a fire investigation at a structure fire on Cutler Road.

July 3, 2015, 2:06 a.m. - ELFD was dispatched to 496/127 for a brush fire. Truck 12 responded emergency. Upon arrival they were unable to locate anything at the dispatch location. MSU and EL Police located two trash cans on fire on Clippert. Truck 12 arrived to the same location to find two contained trash cans on fire in a parking lot. Firefighters extinguished the fires with tank water and then cleared.

July 6, 2015, 4:17 a.m. – ELFD was dispatched to assist LFD on a structure fire on Jenison. EL Battalion 11 arrived at the scene and assisted LFD B-41 with fire tactics and safety. ELFD Truck 11 and air trailer were dispatched to the scene for manpower. Lansing B-41 cleared all ELFD units and they returned to East Lansing.

July 7, 2015, 6:44 a.m. – East Lansing Truck 11 was dispatched to a car fire at the Bailey Community Center. They arrived to find a fire in the engine area and consuming the front portion of the car from the firewall forward. Firefighters pulled a line and extinguished the fire. They then requested ELPD, a tow truck and EL Fire Investigator. Salvage and overhaul took place as the fire crew gained access to the engine compartment with a K-12 saw. The vehicle was unlocked and nothing suspicious noted. The owner was on the scene for entire duration and stated they arrived and then found out that their car was on fire. Truck 11 also laid Peat Sorb down to catch residual fluids leaking from the vehicle. ELPD arrived as well as Fire Prevention. The vehicle was inspected briefly by the fire investigator and then the tow operator removed the vehicle and the area was cleaned up by EL fire personnel. They then cleared the scene and returned to fire station 1.

Training Reported in FireRMS page 2 of 2

July 2, 2015, 1:30-4:30 p.m. – Manipulative Driving Skills - Annual driver training completed by two on duty personnel. It was a road course through the City of East Lansing.

July 7 and 9, 2015, 1:30-2:30 p.m. - Operations – All on duty personnel had EMS Protocol review.

July 9, 2015, 2:30-5:00 p.m. – Manipulative Driving Skills – Two on duty personnel drove the road course with EL Truck 11.

July 9, 2015, 3:00-4:15 p.m. – Driver/Operator Training – One duty fire officer drove the road course for their yearly drivers training.
