**Fires Reported in FireRMS**

February 28, 2016, 9:45 p.m. - Dispatched to a possible structure fire that was originally toned out as a fire alarm on Abbot Rd. T-11 was already en route when dispatch stated it was a possible kitchen fire with the basement filling with smoke. T-11 was the first to arrive with nothing visible. EL Battalion 11 arrived shortly thereafter, establishing command while T-11 crew entered the structure to investigate. M-12 was assigned to do a 360, reporting smoke from the basement level. T-11 reported haze of smoke in the basement. No active fire and but using a fire extinguisher to extinguish a smoldering bag of linen in kitchen area. They also requested ventilation so the M-11 crew set up vent fan for PPV. The fire was reported out by T-11 and asked for EL Fire Investigator to be notified. E-11 reported to command regarding effectiveness of ventilation and to work on shutting off the alarm. T-11 stated they were able to handle so command was transferred to them and all other units cleared.

February 29, 2016, 3:00 p.m. - Called for a possible structure fire on Chandler Road reported by a transportation company. Updated en route to flames visible on the rear balconies per the management staff. EL Battalion called for mutual aid of 2 engines, 1 truck and 2 battalion chiefs. Received mutual aid from Lansing, Lansing Township, Meridian Township, Bath and DeWitt Township fire departments. EL Battalion 11 arrived to find a 3 story large apartment building with smoke showing from the eaves and peak vents. Continued around the building and found the second and third floor balconies fully involved and extending into the attic. EL T-11 and M-11 were assigned to set up and put water on the balconies from the exterior. They then reported to the third floor for fire attack and primary search. EL T-12 and M-12 were assigned to set up their ladder defensively at the corner and reported to clear out tenants and check for extension on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. LFD B-41 was assigned to manage on-deck staging. LFD E-48 arrived and was assigned to the third floor for fire attack. LFD T-41 arrived and was ordered to set up for defensive operations on one of the corners. LFD E-42 was assigned to the 2nd floor for search and fire attack. All other approaching apparatus was ordered to check in with LFD B-41 for on-deck staging. Conditions changed back and forth from controlled to uncontrolled as ventilation and wind conditions changed. Salvage and overhaul operations took a long time. Before clearing firefighters walked the building several times and used the TIC to look for hot spots. EL cleaned up equipment, hose lines and returned to station one.
