Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 3

April 2, 2016, 6:16 p.m. - Called for a mutual aid assist to MTFD for a possible fire on Toward Gardens Circle. EL arrived to find nothing visible and met with Meridian Command and awaited assignment. Interior crews reported no fire found and then EL was cleared by Meridian.

April 4, 2016, 4:05 p.m. - Responded to Lansing Township on a commercial fire on Detroit Street. T-12 had already been dispatched and was on the scene. EL Command met up with LTFD Command to help in any way they needed. The fire was out shortly arrival and then EL Command was cleared.

April 6, 2016, 9:23 a.m. - Dispatched to the MSU Recycling Center for a fire. All units went to Metro 1. B-11 arrived at the scene to find a single story commercial building with heavy smoke that was venting out of an overhead door area. Farm Lane Command was set up. T-12 and M-12 were assigned fire attack, T-11 was assigned water supply and M-11 was assigned RIT. B-11 requested a BC, Truck, (2) engines, and a medic from LFD. MSU Employees were on the scene and reported the fire was in a conveyor belt. They also reported a 5x5 opening in the floor. B-11 completed a 360 of the building. The overhead doors were opened and heavy smoke and fire were noted. T-11 completed water supply and deployed attack lines. T-12 and M-12 were redirected to another side for fire attack. LFD units arrived at the scene. Their B-41 was assigned to a side and their T-41, E-41, and E-42 assisted with fire attack, roof report, and primary search of the office area. MSU IPF shut down the gas, electric, HVAC, and fire alarm system to the building. The EL Fire Marshal was on the scene also. EL T-12 reported the fire was out and had used a PPVF on the 2nd floor area and found no heat or fire noted with the TIC. All crews completed salvage, overhaul, and general clean up. LFD rigs were cleared and the scene was turned over to MSU Police and EL Fire Marshal. All ELFD rigs cleared the scene.

April 6, 2016, 11:50 a.m. - Dispatched to a location on Collingwood for an oven fire. B-11 arrived at the scene to find nothing showing from the exterior. T-12 was assigned to investigate, T-11 and M-12 were advised to stage. T-12 advised no fire and could handle the call. T-11 and M-12 were cleared from the call. Command was passed to T-12 and B-11 cleared the scene.

Fires Reported in FireRMS page 2 of 3

April 12, 2016, 8:15 p.m. - Dispatched for food on the stove and the alarm sounding on Park Lane. T-11 went en route emergent with 3 on board. They arrived on the scene of a 2 story structure with nothing visible from the exterior and the occupants were still inside the house. T-11 investigated. They entered the house to find no fire, smoke or alarm sounding. The occupant stated that the food on the stove just caught on fire and there was no grease involved. They extinguished the fire with making soda and flour and there was no damage. It was noted that several of the burners were full of burnt food/grease/ect. This is likely what was ignited. Advised them to clean the burner pans and they should not have any further issues if they did. Advised dispatch of finding and cleared.

April 13, 2016, 7:06 a.m. – Dispatched to assist LFD with a fire on Reasoner. No more information available due to the narrative was not complete on the report.

April 13, 2016, 11:43 p.m. - Dispatched to a structure fire on Waverly Road. Responded and arrived on the scene and did a face to face with command. Instructed to check with LTFD medic on victim status/needs. LTFD advised 2 refusals and 1 unknown at this time. M11 stayed by command post until they were cleared by command.

Training as Reported in FireRMS

April 1, 2016, 9 a.m. – noon – Ropes & Knots – A couple of on duty personnel used the hose tower at Station #1 for preparation for the Metro Rope Rescue training. They practiced single-man pick-offs, non-entry rescues, and packaging and rescue of medical patients on catwalks.

April 4, 2016, 1:30-3:30 p.m. - Special Rescue Situations – All on duty personnel Had AVI LE class. Presented by Sgt. Mark Smith from ELPD.

April 7, 2016, 2:30-4:00 p.m. – Inspection/Care/Maintain SCBA – All on duty shift personnel performed their annual SCBA testing and inspections. They were then tested on inspections and physical donning of SCBA and structural FF gear.

April 8, 2016, 9-11 a.m. - Special Rescue Situations – All on duty personnel had AVI LE class that was presented by Sgt. Mark Smith from ELPD.

April 8, 2016, 9-11 a.m. – Operations - All personnel had review of several bandages and tourniquets that are in the AVI bags. A video was watched, demonstrated and then practiced. Reviewed further equipment to be coming and its purpose. Also, went through the AVI Medical portion and Tri-County MCI protocol slides and discussion. Reviewed and practiced START and JUMP START protocols.

April 12, 2016, 1:30-3:00 p.m. – Special Considerations – All personnel had review of several bandages and tourniquets that are in the AVI bags. A video was watched, demonstrated and then practiced. Reviewed further equipment to be coming and its purpose. Also, went through the AVI Medical portion and Tri-County MCI protocol slides and discussion. Reviewed and practiced START and JUMP START protocols.

April 12, 2016, 6-8 p.m. p.m. – Special Considerations – 3 East Lansing personnel attended an Honor Guard Training Seminar put on by ELFD. The drills was at Gorsline Runciman Funeral Home.

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April 13, 2016, 1:30-2:30 p.m. – Other Administration Training – All on duty personnel received a demonstration and then practiced applying three new tourniquets that will be in service in the active violence incident gear.

April 14, 2016, 1:30-2:30 p.m. – Trauma – All on duty personnel received EMS/AVI training with new bleeding control equipment.
