May 17, 2016, 7:12 p.m. - Called for a stove/cooking fire in a structure on Wintercrest. EL Command was on location and advised T11 to do an investigation of the occupancy. They arrived to find no smoke or flames and the occupants had self-evacuated the structure. Firefighters found burnt food on the burner of an electric stove and some soot around the burner element. They unplugged the stove from the wall socket and the owners were advised to have a service technician come and fix/repair the stove prior to any more use.

May 19, 2016, 8:42 p.m. - East Lansing Fire was dispatched for a structure fire on Abbot. A box alarm was dispatched to the call with a total of 14 personnel responding. Engine 11 arrived and reported light smoke on the third floor and smell of something burning. Battalion 11 arrived on the scene and assumed command of the incident. Station 1 units arrived on the scene and Medic and Engine 11 were assigned to do an interior search. Truck 11 was assigned on-deck on the alpha side at first. Interior fire crews reported food on the stove and that the fire had been extinguished by neighbor with a fire extinguisher. Truck 11 was assigned to assist with ventilation and Truck 12 was assigned on deck position. Battalion 11 requested the on-duty EL Fire Inspector and to notify the EL Fire Chief. Battalion also requested that Management Company be contacted for the on-call maintenance personnel. Lansing Battalion 41 and Engine 48 advised that they were level one staged on Abbot at the entrance to the complex. Battalion 11 did not request Lansing Fire to respond so they were cleared by EL Command. EL Truck 11 officer had a face to face with Battalion 11 and stated that the incident was a pot on the stove that caused some damage to the stove and cabinets around it. The interior crews checked walls with the Thermal Imager Camera and found no extension. Truck 12, Medic 12, Truck 11 and Medic 11 cleared. Engine 11 remained on the scene. The on-duty EL Fire Inspector arrived on the scene and the information was passed to him. EL Battalion 11 transferred command to Engine 11 and then cleared the scene.
