Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 2

June 30, 2016, 12:34 p.m. – ELFD was called to a grass fire on Trowbridge at 127. Arrived to find a 20 x 30' area that had burned, but was out. Firefighters used a front jump line to mop up some hot spots, obtained information from the workers on scene and then cleared.

June 30, 2016, 1:53 p.m. – EL Fire T-11 was dispatched to a mulch fire that started some building material on fire on the exterior of an apartment complex on Abbot Road. T-11 was advised en route that maintenance had extinguished the fire. Upon arrival found apartment personnel applying water to mulch and exterior of siding. Firefighters did not find any smoke or fire. However, there was a small amount of siding affected and some burnt mulch. The Thermal Imaging Camera showed no heat signature. Firefighters performed overhaul and found no fire extension. The EL Fire Marshal was contacted and fire units cleared with dispatch.

July 7, 2016, 4:59 p.m. - Called for something burning and smoking in an oven on Burnt Tree Lane. Upon arrival firefighters went to one of the apartments and met with the occupant who stated they turned on the oven and then smelled smoke from inside it. They then called the fire department and did not open it. Firefighters unplugged the oven and found that a piece of plastic wear was left in the oven. The owner was advised not to use the oven until the burnt plastic was removed or will cause a fire. The apartment was ventilated with a positive pressure ventilation fan and then T-11 cleared.

July 2, 2016, 7:33 p.m. - Dispatched to a shed that was smoldering on Park Lake Road. Arrived and found occupants and neighbors in the back yard of address. They were spraying two garden hoses on the remnants of an approximate 6 x 8' shed which was filled with dry firewood. The shed had completely burned to the ground. The remains of the shed and firewood were still smoldering. Occupants stated they were using a charcoal grill earlier today with a chimney tool to ignite the charcoal. They removed the chimney tool and set it on the ground next to the shed and went in the house when they were done grilling. The neighbors noticed the shed on fire and notified the occupants. The occupants went outside to find the shed fully involved in fire at which time they called the fire department. On our arrival, there was only a smoldering pile of ashes and burnt logs. Firefighters used almost 500 gallons of water off T-11 to soak the pile and coat the surrounding grass. The EL Fire Marshal was informed of the situation. He stated he would follow up with the occupants later tonight or in the morning.

Fires Reported in FireRMS page 2 of 2

July 2, 2016, 8:45 p.m. - East Lansing Fire was dispatched to assist Meridian Township with a possible structure fire on Huron Hill. EL Truck and Battalion 11 were assigned to the call. Truck 12 was closer and Battalion 11 requested that Truck 12 be assigned to the call and Truck 11 to stand down. Battalion 11 arrived with Truck 12. Battalion 11 assisted MTFD Command at the command post and Truck 12 was assigned duties on the fire ground. Meridian Command cleared both units after the fire was declared out.

July 3, 2016, 6:08 p.m. - B-11 enroute to a call on Foxfire with smoke coming from a second floor apartment. Reported as no fire with language barrier per dispatch. B-11 arrived to find a 2 story apartment building with nothing showing. T-11 to investigate and M-11 staged. T-11 advised no fire upon investigation. B-11 and M-11 cleared the scene and returned to station #1.

Training Reported in FireRMS

June 30, 2016, no time – Fire Streams – All on duty personnel had hose deployment and fire streams training.

July 2, 2016, 6:50-7:20 p.m. – Driver/Operator Training – On duty firefighter demonstrated proficiency in the ELFD driving course.

July 5, 2016, 9:30-10:30 a.m. – Engine Company Attack Evolutions - Both stations of on duty personnel practiced hook up for stand pipe and sprinklers for Holmes and Hubbard Hall at MSU. Also, practiced high rise packs.

July 5, 2016, 2-4 p.m. – Pumper Operator - Aerial and pump training. Practiced pumping from hydrant, relay pumping and aerial set up.

July 7, 2016, 1:30-3:00 p.m. – Personal Protective Equipment – All on duty fire personnel did their annual gear inspection of turn out gear. They also watched 3 RIT training videos.
