Fires Reported in FireRMS

September 25, 2016, 1:04 a.m. - Dispatched for a dumpster fire on Bogue. T-12 en route emergent with 3 on board, sent to area of Abbot Hall and located the fire in the alley behind frat houses. This was a fully involved dumpster fire with vehicles nearby which was extinguished by firefighters. MSU DPS was also on the scene.

September 25, 2016, 6:48 a.m. - Dispatched for a propane tank fire at Adams Field. T-12 en route emergent with 3 on board. Arrived at the scene to find a propane tank with fire coming out the spicket of the bottle. The fire was minimal. Firefighters attempted to shut off at the valve but were unsuccessful. They put the fire out with a gloved hand and also attempt to tighten the handle down with channel locks but were unsuccessful. Advised dispatch that the fire was out and that they were transporting the tank back to station 2 to off the gas.

October 1, 2016, 11:58 p.m. - East Lansing Fire was dispatched to a reported mattress on fire in the alley behind the 400 block of Evergreen. T-11 was assigned to the call and responded with 3 personnel. They arrived and found a small mattress on fire in the alley. The crew used the booster line to extinguish the fire. The mattress was removed from the traffic path and T- 11 cleared the scene.

October 2, 2016, 1:51 p.m. - Dispatch toned us out for a structure fire in Lansing on Townsend. B-11 en route emergent. They could hear rigs clear en route but Battalion did not advise to clear. Arrived on the scene and met up with LFD Battalion who cleared all rigs. We advised dispatch and returned to quarters.

Training Reported in FireRMS

September 27, 2016, 1:30-3:30 p.m. – Trauma – All on duty personnel had Trauma Practical Splinting, Traction splint and KED board training.

October 5, 2016, 1:30-3:30 p.m. – Firefighting Tactics - Real time scenarios with laddering, pumping and blue card command functions. Pulled hand lines, ran off tank, switched to hydrant, set ground and truck ladders up for egress and patient rescue.

October 6, 2016 1:30-1600 – Fire Streams - Pump training for a firefighter. Also, all on duty personnel had education on the Cleveland load for high rise packs and triple load for cross lays.
