Fires Reported in FireRMS page 1 of 2

October 28, 2016, 12:54 p.m. - T-12 was dispatched to a fire alarm on Garden City Road. They arrived to find nothing showing from a medium sized two story structure. Firefighters investigated to find the alarm sounding and panel showing in one of the apartments. They investigated to find that the occupant was cooking and burned food in the oven setting off the smoke detector. The T-12 crew ventilate the apartment of light smoke and the system was reset to normal operation. They then cleared and returned to station 2.

November 1, 2016, 10:32 p.m. – Truck 12 and Medic 12 dispatched to assist Mason Fire Department on a structure fire on Aurelius Road. Upon arrival M-12 and T-12 staged but then were then cleared by Mason command.

November 2, 2016, 4:57 p.m. - East Lansing Fire was dispatched to assist Meridian Township Fire Department on Marsh Road for a structure fire. EL Battalion and Truck 11 were assigned to the call and responded with a total of four personnel. Enroute, Meridian Township Battalion requested a medic unit so EL Medic 11 responded for a total of six personnel on scene from East Lansing. EL Battalion arrived and assisted the Meridian Township Battalion with command. Truck 11 was assigned too many fire ground tasks from fire control to primary search. Medic 11 was medic standby, then assigned to a medic call in Meridian. Once the fire was declared under control Meridian Township cleared all East Lansing personnel and they returned to quarters.

November 3, 2016, 8:24 a.m. - Dispatched to assist Meridian Township Fire Department on a structure on Marsha Road. On arrival EL Battalion met up with Meridian command and helped them coordinate crews. EL T-12 also responded and was assigned tasks. EL T-11 was also dispatch a few minutes later for manpower. The fire was controlled and reported out shortly thereafter. EL T-11 was then placed back into service while EL B-11 and T-12 remained on the scene and then later cleared.
