March 9-16, 2017

Fires Reported in FireRMS – page 1 of 2

March 10, 2017, 7:55 p.m. – ELFD responded to assist MTFD on a car fire near the apartment building on Endenhall Way. Upon arrival established water supply and reported to MTFD Command. EL T-11 crew was sent up to help extinguish the car fires which involved 4 cars. Once the fires were out EL units were cleared by Meridian.

March 13, 2017, 6:25 p.m. - Called for a possible structure fire on Lake Lansing Road. Upon arrival the occupant met fire personnel at the curb and stated their apartment was filling with smoke. Firefighters went to the apartment with a water can. When the door was opened smoke was banked down to three feet from the floor. Fire personnel made entry looking for the fire using a TIC they found the source of heat near a dog cage with the bedding on fire out which they moved of the apartment. The carpet and pad were on fire also and there was a slight char on the floor. Firefighters put out with a watering can and opened the windows to ventilate. They EL Fire Marshal took over and fire units cleared the scene.

March 14, 2017, 3:03 p.m. - Dispatched to a fire alarm sounding on Gr. River. Upon arrival firefighters found no one had evacuated and heard no smoke detectors. They went to the apartment and met with the occupant and employee. The occupant stated they were trying to deep fry food on the stove top when the pan of oil ignited into flames. They moved the pan to the sink and applied water on it which increased the flames to the ceiling. Once the flames stopped they called 911 to say there was no fire. The building maintenance was also on the scene to assess the damage. Firefighters found no flames or damage to any surrounding cabinets or plastic pieces. There was only soot on the cabinets and ceiling. Firefighters also advised the occupant how to correctly extinguish a grease fire. They then contacted the EL Fire Marshal who sent the fire inspector to the scene. Once he arrived the scene was turned over to him all fire units cleared.

March 16, 2017 12:53 p.m. – The East Lansing Fire Department responded to a possible structure fire on Buteo Drive. B-11 enroute along with STO. Upon turning on to Coleman Rd, observed moderate gray smoke from within the subdivision. Requested 2 more engines, 1 medic and a BC. Upon arrival of scene, found a two story residential light weight residential structure with light smoke coming out of the it. Also showing was active fire and heavier smoke coming from the eaves. EL T-11 was directed to park in front of structure, pull a line and knock down the active fire now coming through the 2nd story of the structure. T-12 was to park at the hydrant and lay a line to T-11. M-12 to assist them. LFD B-41, E-48, T-41 arrived on the scene. E-41 broke a window on first floor assisting the knockdown by T-12. Meridian Battalion 91 and M-91 on scene also. MTFD M-91 and EL M-11 were sent to do a 360 and shut off gas. Once the fire was knocked down dispatch was advised. The EL Fire Chief was also contacted. Once the EL Fire Marshal was on the scene he was advised what transpired from start to current time fire units began to clear.

Fires Reported in FireRMS – page 1 of 2

March 16, 2017, 3:46 p.m. - T-12 was dispatched to Chestnut Road for a small mulch fire in the planter area. T-12 responded emergent with three on board. Dispatch notified T-12 that MSUPD was on the scene and the fire was out. T-12 stepped down to normal traffic. They arrived at a 6 story dormitory with MSUPD standing near the planter area with a dry-chemical extinguisher. MSUPD led T-12 to a corner of the planter area where mulch was smoldering in a 6 foot by 1 foot area along a brick wall. Evidence of dry chemical powder on ground and on brick. T-12 utilized a 5 gallon bucket to carry 10 gallons of water from the truck to the smoldering mulch. The fire was extinguished and T-12 cleared.

Training Reported in FireRMS

March 14, 2017, 1:30-2:15 p.m. – RAT Team – All on duty fire personnel had a tour with MSU EHS of the Water Treatment Facility on campus. Special attention to the chlorine system used to treat water.

March 15, 2017, no time listed – Haz-Mat Incident Scene Safety – All on duty fire personnel toured the MSU Water Treatment Facility for Haz-Mat recognition. There were also accompanied by EHS personnel from MSU.
