Fires Reported in FireRMS – page 1 of 2

March 19, 2017, 10:54 a.m. - Dispatched for a possible structure fire in an apartment on Arbor Glen Dr. B-11 en route emergent and arrived on the scene to be advised by ELPD that is likely food on the stove, door is locked, and odor is of burnt food. This was a 3 story multi residential structure with very light smoke coming from the windows. M-11 on the scene and instructed to go to the apartment and force door, making access to the room. T-12 arrived on the scene and advised to meet up with M-11 with watering can and Thermal Imaging Camera. M-11 confirmed it was food on the stove. Fire department personnel met up with occupants who stated they had just run to the store and did not recall leaving anything on the stove. The fire captain called for ventilation and M-11 or T-12 were assigned this task to carryout. T-11 staged as they came from another call. Once ventilation was complete, command terminated and rigs cleared.

March 19, 2017, 5:35 p.m. – ELFD was called for a fire alarm going off on Michigan Avenue and advised that it was food on the stove but no fire. The fire department arrived and found smoke on the 2nd floor in the hallway and the alarm was going off. No fire or hazards in the apartment. The hallway was vented and the alarm reset to normal. Truck 12 then cleared.

March 21, 2017, 12:08 a.m. – East Lansing Fire was dispatched to a possible structure fire at Akers Hall. 13 East Lansing Firefighters responded to the call. Truck 12 arrived on scene and took Medic 12 to fire floor to investigate. Truck and Medic 11 level one staged upon arrival. Battalion arrived on the scene and after a brief report from Truck 12, Battalion 11 took command. Truck 12 reported that they had a small fire in the bathroom and they were controlling it with fire extinguishers. Truck 12 requested ventilation and Truck 11 was assigned this task. Medic 12 did a primary search of floors above and below with all clear being given. Medic units were not needed any longer and per command cleared to return to quarters. Truck 11 was released by command, Battalion transferred command to Truck 12 and cleared the scene.

March 21, 2017, 7:15 p.m. – ELFD was dispatched to a possible vehicle fire at Saginaw and Beechlawn. EL Truck 11 arrived to find a vehicle parked on Beechlawn with the hood up and small fire on the wire harness. Firefighters extinguished it with a watering can and stayed on the scene and cooled off the motor with water. ELPD and tow service arrived and then Truck 11 cleared.

March 22, 2017, 8:20 p.m. – EL Fire was called to assist to MTFD on a fire alarm on Ivywood Drive. EL fire arrived and Meridian B91 advised it was food on the stove but no fire and EL fire could clear. EL Truck 12 did so and returned to station 2.
