Fires Reported in FireRMS – page 1 of 2

March 23, 2017, 2:16 p.m. - Dispatched to a possible mulch fire on Collingwood. Upon arrival firefighters found a small area of mulch smoldering. They put the fire out with a bucket of water and then cleared the scene.

March 24, 2017, 4:13 p.m. - Called to the area of Woodingham for an illegal burn. Arrived at a residence to find the occupant had 2 open barrels full of yard debris and rubbish burning in the back yard, about 15-18 feet from house, in the lawn. The occupant came outside and was very confrontational about not needing a burn permit and indicated what he was doing was legal. Fire personnel advised him he would need to put the fires out. He begrudgingly did so. He was also advised he could visit station to see the rules and regulations involved with a recreational burn permit, but he was not interested. Firefighters cleared and informed dispatch there may be residual smoke as he continued to extinguish the fires.

March 25, 2017, 2:57 a.m. - T-12 was dispatched to fire alarm at University Village. Fire personnel arrived and investigated to find the fire panel reading a smoke head detector for one of the apartments. The occupant met fire personnel at the door and stated that they were cooking food which caused the smoke head to activate. T-12 investigated to find an oven mitt had burned that was left on an electric burner after the occupant had cooked. Fire personnel also noted that there was no smoke because the occupant had aired the room out prior to our arrival. T-12 reset fire alarm panel and returned to fire station #2.

March 28, 2017, 7:30 p.m. – The East Lansing Fire Department was dispatched to a structure fire on West Shore Drive. EL B-11 went en route emergent. While en route they were placed on Metro 1 and advised that a person was cooking on the stove, left it and then found a fire when they returned. B-11 arrived on the scene of a 4 quadrant, 2 story condo with moderate smoke coming out of one of the windows. Requested for mutual aid from Lansing Fire. EL T-11 directed to enter through the apartment to attack the fire. EL T-11 took 1 3/4" line in through to the apartment on fire with M-11. E-11 cleared the apartment on both sides of the fire utilizing a TIC and 4 gas. EL T-12 entered through a balcony to break the window and assisted T-11 personnel inside. They advised it was a kitchen fire, the fire was knocked down and ventilation was needed. Lansing B-41, E-48, E-41 arrived on the scene and helped with various fire activities. The EL Fire Marshal arrived on the scene and was provided an update on what had transpired. Upon confirming that the fire was knocked down and no extension, advised dispatch and EL Command released all mutual aid assistance. Spoke with occupants who stated they were boiling water and went to watch TV in the bedroom. They came out about 20 minutes later to find the kitchen was full of flames. They tried to put the fire out and then called 911 and left the apartment. T-11 provided lighting to the EL Fire Marshal for further investigation of the area. He then made arrangements with management to have the apartment boarded up, command terminated and then all rigs returned to quarters.

March 23, 2017, 1:30-3:30 p.m. – Pumper Operations – On duty personnel performed pump operation training flowing water to multiple lines. They practiced deployment and repacking of triple layer hose line. They also practiced use of the vehicle stabilization kit.

March 29, 2017, 1:30-3:00 p.m. – Other Hose Training – On duty personnel practiced loading and deploying different cross-lays on T-11. They used the flat, triple and Cleveland loads.
