



GLENCAIRN NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

Water Main, Sewer, and Roadway Improvements

Frequently Asked Questions and Additional Information:

- 1. Why is this project happening?**
 - This project will provide improvements to aging water and sewer infrastructure, as well as the roadways in this area.
- 2. What improvements are included in this project?**
 - This project will resurface over 2.5 miles of roadways, replace over 7,000 feet of water main, and approximately 3,000 feet of large diameter combined sewer.
 - The water main replacement is limited to the southern portion of the project area due to condition assessment and age of infrastructure.
- 3. When is construction scheduled to begin? How long will it take?**
 - Work is expected to begin on June 1, 2021 and the work in the neighborhood is expected to extend into the fall of 2021.
 - The work will take place in phases throughout the duration of the project and the milling and resurfacing of the roads is expected to occur towards the end of the project.
- 4. What are the working hours of the contractor?**
 - City standard work hours are from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday through Saturday.
- 5. Will emergency vehicle access be maintained?**
 - Yes, emergency vehicle access will be maintained at all times and first responders will be provided updates about closures and traffic shifts.
- 6. Will the City's trash/recycling services be disrupted during this project?**
 - No. The City will be able to collect residential trash and recycling on residents' normally scheduled curbside collection days.
- 7. Will there be any disruption to my water and sewer service?**
 - In certain areas there will be minor water service interruptions. A three-day notice will be provided for any impacted properties. These interruptions normally last less than eight hours.
- 8. If I have a lead or galvanized water service, will that be replaced as part of this project?**
 - To comply with the State's Lead and Copper Rule, the City will be verifying water services in the project area and will replace any lead or galvanized water service in conjunction with this project. - 9. Will I be able to access my driveway during construction?**
 - Any driveway scheduled to be impacted by construction will be closely coordinated with the owner and will be timed to minimize impacts. PACE will be notified of the construction in the area to allow for street parking.



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- 10. What do I need to do with my underground sprinkler systems or invisible underground fencing located in the street right-of-way?**
- Property owners are responsible for items placed in the street right-of-way (typically between the sidewalk and the curb). These items shall be clearly marked with flags or stakes to show their location.
- 11. Who is responsible for funding and financing this project? How much will it cost?**
- This project will be funded by the City of East Lansing using State local road funds, income tax revenue, water rates, and sewer rates.
 - The overall engineering, administrative and construction cost is approximately \$3.5 million.
- 12. Who all is involved in the project?**
